2022/23 Financial Report

Financial Highlights

- 1. Core revenues up \$53,000 or 38%; Surplus of \$35,000
- 2. Capital Investments:
 - a. \$290,000 in the last three years
 - b. \$600,000 since 2019 (*includes ice makers' shed July/Aug)
- 3. Final COVID-19 Relief payment (\$11K); Total over the last three fiscal years: \$109,000
- 4. Capital Fund Balance: Yr End: \$233,000
 - a. After Ice Makers Shed/Railing: ~\$130,000




HCC Operating Revenues

2023/24 Curling Rate Considerations

Considerations when determining potential rates for the upcoming season:

- Review past year financials for operating balance
- Board budget for 2023/2024 curling season
 - Estimate income and expenses for coming season
- Understand current running operating balance Year over Year
- Past years' rates and increases



Recommendations

No change to:

- → Membership fees
- → Capital fund contributions
- → CurlOn/Curling Canada membership dues
- → Full year discount

(current budget reflects a small positive balance)



Additional Recommendations

- 1. Introduce a "spare" league for members who want to commit to one league, but be available as a spare in other leagues:
 - Members select this league to make their membership unlimited and avoid any sparing fees



Additional Recommendations

- 2. Introduce a Masters/Grand Masters (M/GM) rate:
 - This fee will be paid by any M/GM participant who cannot curl in one of our club's regular leagues during any session (ie travel), but still would like to play M/GM
 - M/GM participants are encouraged to continue to be an active member of the curling club via league participation
 - If playing in one of our regular leagues, M/GM participants are not required to pay this fee



Additional Recommendations

3. New Gripper program

- As we work towards giving members the best ice conditions, moving forward a new gripper will be added as part of your registration.
- Members will be able to indicate size of gripper required at time of registration
- Cost for 2023/2024 season is \$20, all in

Capital Investments this Summer

Our strong fiscal management and excellent fundraising efforts are allowing us to improve our facility and our ice with more than \$130k in investments this off-season

- ✓ New Ice Technicians' shed
- ✓ Jet Ice system
- ✓ Concrete parking barriers
- ✓ Protective railing around exterior HVAC unit
- ✓ Additional sound baffles
- ✓ Replace kitchen and office windows

- ✓ Kitchen makeover, including new dishwasher
- ✓ New cabinets next to bar
- ✓ Lockable filing cabinet
- ✓ Masonry repair
- ✓ Replace soffits and fascia
- ✓ Repair emergency exit in lounge

The Final Phase - Accessibility!



Our goal is to complete all renovations and be a fully accessible facility within the next 3 seasons, This includes:

- ✓ Fully renovated, accessible change-rooms and washrooms
- ✓ Installation of an elevator with access to all three levels
- ✓ New front entrance with automatic doors
- ✓ New portico covering the main entry
- ✓ Building exterior painted





2022/2023 Volunteers of the Year




- This award recognizes HCC members whose leadership and contributions within the past curling season had a significant and positive impact on the Club.
